MMSD UPDATE:

We recently learned of a change to the MMSD policy about entrance into kindergarten. Rather than try to explain it, here is the exact words from the School Board Decision about the age you need to be to enter kindergarten. It does not affect the 4K age requirement.

Five-Year-Old Kindergarten Entrance Age

- 1. A child who becomes five years of age after September 1st in the year s/he seeks admission to five-year-old kindergarten, may enroll in five-year-old kindergarten if:
 - a. The child has successfully completed a four-year-old kindergarten program or its equivalent OR
 - b. The child has been admitted to five-year-old kindergarten in another public school district prior to moving into the Madison Metropolitan School District.
- 2. A child who becomes five years of age between September 1 and October 15 and who does not meet either of the requirements set forth in Sections 1(a) or 1(b), above, may enroll in kindergarten upon parental request.
- 3. A parent/legal guardian shall submit a request for early entrance into five-year-old kindergarten to the SUPERINTENDENT or his/her designee on or before the August 1 preceding the school year for which early entrance is requested. Requests submitted after August 1 will not be considered for the upcoming school year.
- 4. A child seeking early entrance pursuant to Section 2, above, shall be offered the opportunity to be assessed for kindergarten prepardedness using a standardized psychoeducational assessment. The results of such an assessment may be used by parents and staff to inform a decision regarding early entrance but, in no circumstances, may be used to prohibit or deny early entrance.

5. The SUPERINTENDENT or his/her designee has the final authority for deciding whether or not the child is to be admitted to kindergarten

Helpful Hints from the Teachers:

- Have you changed jobs, phone numbers, cell numbers, or any other important contact information? Please keep your teachers updated.
- ✓ Remember to dress kids warmly and prepared for the playground. We prefer no scarves at preschool.
- ✓ Please use the rug runners in the hall to wipe your feet on as you enter the building on snowy days. Tim works hard to keep the floors looking nice.
- ✓ Please keep glass doors shut, we need to keep the cold air out of the building.
- ✓ We are in need to large ice cream buckets with lids if you have any around your house!

Fun Recipes!

Silly Putty

2- Cups white glue (approx.)

1- Cup of liquid starch (approx.)

Drops of food coloring

Add glue to starch. Knead. If it is stringing add more glue, if it is sticky add more starch. Store the silly putty in an airtight container in the refrigerator.

Play Dough

2 tsp. Cream of tartar1-cup water1-cup flour1TBS.oil

½ cup salt food coloring

Put cream of tartar, flour and salt in pan on stove. Add water oil and coloring. Mix well. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until dough forms a ball. Cool and kneed. Store the play dough in an air tight container in refrigerator.



Play Dough

1-1/4 cups flour

½ cup cocoa powder

½ cup salt

½ tablespoon cream of tartar

1-1/2 tablespoons cooking oil

1 cup boiling water

Mix the dry ingredients. Add the oil & boiling water. Stir quickly, mixing well. When cool, mix with your hands. Store the play dough in an airtight container. If the play dough becomes too dry, mix in small amounts of water.

Bubbles

2-cups Joy dish detergent 6 cups water 3/4 cup corn syrup Mix and let stand for 4 hours.
